GNJILANE REGION

No significant criminal incidents reported.

MITROVICA REGION

ASSAULT/ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF WEAPON

Lausa-0930 hrs. An Albanian male reported that his brother had assaulted him and had thrown him out of the house. UNMIK Police recovered a pistol in a tent where the complainant was staying. The case is under investigation.

ASSAULT

Mitrovica North -2030 hrs. Two Serb females reported that an unidentified suspect had attacked them while they were walking on King Peter Street.

PEC REGION

THEFT OF MOTOR VEHICLE

Pec. Two different Italian NGO employees reported that unknown persons had stolen their NGO vehicles.

ATTEMPTED RAPE/KIDNAPPING

Dakovica 1630 hrs. An Albanian female reported that an identified Albanian male forced her into his vehicle at gunpoint, drove to another location and threatened to kill her if she did not have sex with him. The victim escaped on foot. Investigation is continuing.

DEAD BODY FOUND

Decani. A female body of unknown ethnicity was discovered near her accommodation. No further information is known at this time.

PRISTINA REGION

RAPE

Pristina-0335 hrs. An Albanian female was raped by four identified Albanian youngsters. All four were arrested by UNMIK Police.

PRIZREN REGION

LOOTING

Stajkovce-1530 hrs. Four Albanian males were arrested for looting an abandoned house located in the Serbian village.

THREATS

Prizren-1100 hrs. An Albanian female living in an accommodation, owned by her employer, was threatened by her supervisor, an Albanian male. He allegedly told her that if she did not leave her flat voluntarily that he would break into her flat with a gun and kill her.

BORDER POLICE

ENTRY REFUSAL

Pristina Airport-1000 hrs. Twelve Turkish citizens, Kurdish ethnicity arrived from Istanbul. They claimed to be tourists. The suspects were interviewed and it was established that they had no final destination or knowledge of Kosovo. Further investigation revealed that they came to Kosovo because there was no visa requirement and that they wanted to enter Western Europe illegally, possibly through Albania. All of them were sent back to Turkey.

SHOOTING

On 05 June at 1325 hrs., a shooting between Macedonian soldiers and five smugglers occurred as they tried to enter Macedonia illegally. No further information regarding injuries is available.
