UPDATE

07 JUNE, 2000

THIS UPDATE COVERS THE 24-HOUR PERIOD CONCLUDED AT MIDNIGHT 06 JUNE, 2000.
PREPARED BY 1100 HRS. ON 07 JUNE, 2000.

GNJILANE REGION

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Urosevac-2355 hrs. An Albanian male reported that while driving on route "Hawk", he was flagged down by two unknown young Albanian males who requested him to pull his vehicle off on a side road. One of the suspects had a pistol and fired a round in his direction as he sped away. No injuries reported.

ROBBERY

Vacanes-1500 hrs. A Serb female stated that two unidentified Albanian males entered her house and threatened to kill her. The suspects stole an amount of money from her.

MITROVICA REGION

ASSAULT

Mitrovica South -0000 hrs. An Albanian male reported that two unidentified males had assaulted him with a hammer. No information on the extent of injuries.

Mitrovica North -1630 hrs. A Turkish male was assaulted by four unidentified males. The reason was believed to be his ethnic background.

Mitrovica North -1740 hrs. An Albanian male reported that four unidentified Serb males had assaulted him.

ARSON

Mitrovica North -0215 hrs.. An apartment was destroyed by fire. No information on motive or ownership.

PEC REGION

MURDER/ATTEMPTED MURDER

Pec-0220 hrs. Unidentified masked gunmen forcibly entered the residence of an Albanian family. The suspects shot and killed a 72-year-old Albanian male and another Albanian male was also shot and injured. The victims were living in a previously Serbian owned apartment but there was no preliminary indication this was a motive. This investigation is ongoing.

MORTAR ATTACK/DEMONSTRATION

Gorazdevac-0030 hrs. Unidentified persons fired three mortar rounds towards a Serbian village. Two rounds impacted just outside of the village, one exploded in the village. As a result of this attack, one Serbian female was slightly injured and evacuated to a KFOR hospital. At noon 50-60 Serbs blocked the main road in the village and occupied the elementary school requesting an urgent meeting with the KFOR commander. After the meeting the crowd dispersed.

THREAT

Pec-1600 hrs. An Albanian female was threatened with physical harm by alleged KPC/TMK members if she did not leave her residence.

ATTEMPTED MURDER

Dakovica-1200 hrs. An Albanian male reported that an identified Albanian male shot at him with an AK-47, but missed. This incident occurred following a confrontation between the victim and the suspect where the victim reportedly cut the suspect with his knife. Investigation is ongoing.

ATTEMPTED MURDER

Dakovica-0230 hrs. An Albanian male reported that unknown persons in a moving vehicle, shot at him with an automatic weapon. No injuries reported. Investigation is ongoing.

PRISTINA REGION

GRENADE ATTACK

Gracanica-1000 hrs. A hand grenade was thrown from a passing vehicle into a market place injuring several Serbs. As a result of this incident an aggressive mob of local Serbs blocked the main road and attacked Albanians that were at the scene at that time. Several Albanians were injured and several civilian vehicles were burned. Two UNMIK Police vehicles were damaged as well. KFOR and UNMIK Police were dispatched to the area but the crowd became very violent and attacked KFOR soldiers. Shots were fired by KFOR and there were reported injuries. GRENADE ATTACK

Magura-2330 hrs. Unidentified suspects threw a hand grenade in front of a house owned by a male Bosniac. No injuries were reported but there was minor property damage.

HIT AND RUN ACCIDENT/FATALITY

Glogovac-1130 hrs. A 25-year-old Albanian male was fatally struck by an unidentified driver. UNMIK Police are continuing their investigation.

PRIZREN REGION

ATTEMPTED MURDER

Suva Reka-2100 hrs. A known male suspect (ethnicity not reported) assaulted a known male victim (ethnicity not reported) and struck the victim in the back of the head with an axe. The victim was treated at the hospital. The investigation is ongoing.

ARMED ROBBERY

Durmish-1500 hrs. An Albanian male reported that three unidentified young men armed with pistols entered his residence, stole 70 pigeons and threatened to kill him and burn his house if he reported this incident to the police.

BORDER POLICE

No significant criminal incidents reported.
